
The show's programme has been coconstructed by the sector's different stakeholders in order to face these three crucial challenges.

Our sectors are facing numerous challenges, with ever decreasing support. The economic performance of our businesses is vital if we are to continue providing food. On top of that we have to reach this level of performance in the most sustainable manner possible, whilst preserving our resources and adapting to the fluctuations that occur.

You will be able to see it all at the SIVAL . Innovation has always been part of the show's DNA.

The shows two concours, SIVAL Innovation and Agreen Startup, are highly sought-after each year by businesses and project holders as a way forward. By rewarding innovative solutions that are coming or will come in the next few years, supporting development and the adaptation of our farms, they highlight how dynamic our sector is.

Something to attract future market gardeners, fans of machinery, or future tree produces who are passionate about technology.







Facing the challenges of the future

Over the last three years the SIVAL has aimed to be a show that provides solutions for the future of the specialist plant production section.

In 2025, the SIVAL wants to be ambitious : to contribute in order to answer the key challenges of economic performance, sustainability and the attractiveness of the sectors.

As a result the SIVAL has three key challenges in order to prepare for plant production in the future :

• Economic performance

Profitability and competitiveness of farms is essential for their survival and the country's food sovereignty. Innovation, production choices and diversification, yield optimisation, managing skills... The SIVAL aims to show solutions and encourage discussions that help to add value for businesses linked to farm produce.

• Climate : challenge and solutions

The SIVAL offers solutions for adapting crops to climate change and promoting sustainable practices.

• Developing and adding value to the different sectors

With the backing of its partners, the SIVAL is offering both upstream and downstream solutions to improve the attractiveness of the specialist plant production sector. The SIVAL will be contributing to discussions and progress concerning the major subjects of human resources, integration of societal factors, attractiveness and transmission that are the key to the future of the sector and of farms.

Over the years the SIVAL has developed a program that provides food for thought but also solid solutions in order to face these challenges. **The show's two concours** are one of the key driving forces of the SIVAL but more widely the show offers a rich content that is aimed at this transition which is progressing.

A concours that focuses on the innovations from businesses in specialist plant production

SIVAL Innovation is the SIVAL's flagship competition, and more widely, that of the whole of the specialist production sector in France. It provides the opportunity for companies, bodies or associations to propose innovations under different categories:

Varietal innovation

Seeds and plants.

Machinery and automation

Motorised machines and equipment that optimises machinery.

• Plant health, soil and growing supports

Biocontrol, bio stimulants, fertilisers, mulching and other solutions for plant and soil health.

• Equipment for production

Supplies, small equipment and production infrastructures (before being put on the market).

Marketing solutions

Marketing initiatives, packaging and other supplies and small equipment.

• Digital tools, information analysis

Digital applications, computerised decision-making, modelling, traceability, recognition.

Collective initiatives and services

Solutions for support, facilitation, and pooling of knowledge and practices from production to marketing.

IMPORTANT POINTS TO EMPHASISE ABOUT THE 2025 AWARDS

• Equipment and production supplies has been strongly represented this year

Remarkably this category has 8 prizewinners. Amongst them, two Gold prizewinners: a patented system that provides the creation of two grafts in the form of a Y to create trees in two axes, and intended for narrow orchards or in 2D. This innovation prepares the orchards for future mechanisation.

• The second Gold prize has been awarded for a glasshouse production solution with **a glass that diffuses and insulates in order to save energy**, without affecting light transmission. This innovation opens the way to eliminating carbon from glasshouses.

A Silver and four Bronze awards complete the category, with a contact free safety system in order to anticipate danger when using secateurs, two glasshouse production solutions, bird scaring equipment that uses sensors and artificial intelligence as well as a spraying system for useful organisms in a liquid solution.

The exceptional content of this category is a reminder of the DNA of the SIVAL underlining its place as a show for equipment and pragmatic production solutions.

• Plant health, long-awaited solutions

At a time when legislation concerning the use of synthetic pesticides is getting tighter, the search for efficient natural alternatives to combat disease and optimise yield is a necessity.

The jury has underlined the importance of innovation in this sector in order to support production and and provide an optimistic outlook for producers, notably where the transition to agro-ecology is concerned. Therefore it is in this category where a SIVAL Gold medal and a SIVAL Silver medal provide recognition for two biocontrol innovations which are not just simple alternatives but real solutions for plant protection.

The jury emphasised the thoroughness and the reliability that their solutions offered, which were both presented with numerous tests and significant results.

• Machinery, robotics and digital tools, Al and digital systems support innovation

Two solutions received a SIVAL Bronze medal in the category « Machinery and automation » and two SIVAL Silver medals in the category « Digital tools and information analysis ».

Concerning machinery, electric weeding and mechanical hoeing were both improved using artificial intelligence, providing improved performance, information analysis and machine speed. In the category « Digital tools and information analysis », There are programs or applications that aid producer decisionmaking, and information analysis strengthened by artificial intelligence and even crop growth stage and harvesting prediction.

If AI is being integrated more and more frequently in agricultural innovation the competition jury made the remark that these tools have to prove their worth over an extended period.

• Varietal innovation for more vigourous and resistant plant production

Less prolific than in previous years the category « Varietal innovation » rewarded 2 products this year with a SIVAL Gold and Silver medal.

The gold medal was awarded to a graft carrier for an apple tree that is more vigourous and productive with good disease resistance.

The SIVAL Silver medal was awarded to a butternut resistant to a fungal disease that is

already widespread in the south of France and which due to climate change could spread throughout the other regions. This resistance enables the fungal development to be anticipated and therefore limits the use of fungicides, whilst guaranteeing quality and yield.

These innovations, aimed at disease resistance, add to the variety of solutions available for reducing synthetic pesticide use.

•Collective initiatives supporting the sector's attractiveness

Unconventional in the SIVAL Innovation Concours, this category has been created to highlight collective initiatives that put the different professions into the spotlight, experiments based on practices...

This year, three projects have received awards, a serious game whose aim is to expose the careers linked to seeds, and evaluation tool, training and support for agroforestry systems and a series of training videos for high quality vine pruning (in six languages).

This category isn't directly linked to emerging innovations. It does, however, meet the needs linked to the attractiveness of the different sectors in specialist plant production.

THE JURY'S VERDICT

The jury would like to congratulate the 2025 award winners who have tried to find answers for production requirements, with a special mention for the solutions in the Plant Health category. It is noticeable in this year's competition that the innovations are intended for the challenges of the future, in relation to the agro-ecological transition of production systems. In the majority of cases these innovations were supported by digital technology as well as artificial intelligence. Although these concepts need to prove themselves over a long period, the innovations are typical of an agriculture that is ever evolving due to innovation

that is driven by curiosity and courage. Finally the jury wants to congratulate businesses in the sector for their dynamism which has enabled them to innovate and provide a real perspective for the future of producers.





The innovation marathon is celebrating its 10th anniversary !

AGREEN STARTUP

In 2025, Agreen Startup at the SIVAL will be celebrating its 10th anniversary.

Backed by the Chambres d'Agriculture, it appeared for the first time in relation to plants at the SIVAL in 2016, although it already existed in other sectors.

This innovation marathon provides the opportunity for entrepreneurs, professionals with students to develop an innovative project during exactly 48 hours. It is an invitation to exceed one's limits and also to discuss and discover.

Since its arrival at the SIVAL, Agreen Startup 37 project holders have

received awards (26 Prizewinners and 7 Judges favourites) from nearly 90 participating candidates. If certain projects haven't managed to blossom, others are continuing the development such as Agriléa, Orisis, Valoriz-me and also Vanilla Bridge.

The competition rules

Each project holder must create a team with diverse skills (agronomy, dieticians, marketing, communication...) in order to present a finished and viable project at the end of the marathon. These project holders are also accompanied by mentors who will challenge their ideas throughout the duration of the competition.

What have they become ?



Noéline Rasoamandary is the founder of Vanilla Bridge. Having completed her studies in food biochemistry in Madagascar she continued her career in Shanghai in research.

She was selected by the European Union to take part in an ESA Food Identity training programme in 2014. When she left the college in 2018 she took part in the Agreen Startup Concours with her Vanilla BridgeProject, she was awarded the first prize and named as the judges favourite.

What is Vanilla-Bridge?

Vanilla Bridge is a company producing liquid vanilla and vanilla extract from Madagascar. Ourvanilla podscome directly from Madagascan producers. We have a processing unit in Angers where we make syrups, powders and extracts. Our liquid products (syrups and extracts) have the « Produit en Anjou » Label.

Our aim is to add value to local Madagascan producers' work and our aim is to produce high quality, ethical and traceable products. We are the link between Madagascan producers and the consumers here in France, and in Europe.

We market mainly to professionals in the food industry and we are also present in fine food shops in the region. Private customers are welcome to our factory shop.

What is currently happening at Vanilla-Bridge?

It is our sixth year in business and we are currently undergoing expansion. We have just released a range of vanilla syrups that are a huge success.

What is the future for Vanilla-Bridge ?

We want to continue to share vanilla which is often considered to be difficult to use by the greater public. In order to do that we want to release a new product every year as a different way of using vanilla, either as a limited edition or a lasting range.

We are also working on a range of liquid vanilla sugar as well as special editions for the end of year celebrations (KC honey with, vanilla extract).

Vanilla-Bridge and Agreen Startup

I took part in the competition in 2018 on the recommendation of the ESA. I didn't expect to win.

To win the first prize was a real validation and boost whether it was for the construction of the project, the network or the visibility of Vanilla Bridge. Agreen Startup enabled me to structure the idea that I had in my head, and I was helped by people that were competent in their specialist areas. It is a way of challenging oneself and exceeding one's limits.

If I had one word to say to project holders who are thinking about taking part: enter the Agreen Startup Concours !

What have they become ?



Célia Nencioni is cofounder of Valoriz'me. Qualified with a degree specialising in food, she continued with a diploma in entrepreneurship and advice at the ESA in Angers. She

took part in the 2023 Agreen Startup Concours. The Valoriz'me business was officially launched after the competition.

What is Valoriz'me ?

Valoriz'me is an Angers based start-up that makes healthy, tasty and nutritive snacks, using 100% natural French ingredients, aimed mainly at women in order to cope with deficiencies linked to the feminine menstrual cycle. These Valoriz'me products are currently offered for sale online on the young company's website. Two ranges are available at the moment :

- Me'Ball Sport : aimed at sporting women with a formulation that is adapted to suit energy requirements when practising sport.

- Me'Ball Equilibre : for all active women, with a formula that is notably aimed to reduce craving.

- The two ranges that are gluten and lactose free are supplemented with iron, magnesium and copper.

- This formula combats tiredness before, during and after the menstrual cycle.

- These ranges are manufactured entirely at an ESAT in Saint-Barthélémy d'Anjou.

It took four years of research and development and no less than 300 tests with targeted consumers to validate the product and its composition.

Célia was equally supported by a team of experts (nutritionists, dieticians, sports coaches, research and development...). The idea came to her due to her own personal experiences. The young businesswoman practised motorsport at a competitive level during her childhood and as a teenager. At that time of her life she was unable to find natural solutions to compensate for the deficiencies provoked by her menstrual cycle.

Currently at Valoriz'me ?

Valoriz'me is actually working on the development of five savoury new recipes. These new products will be launched at the end of 2025.

Valoriz'me is now looking at products that could have an impact on abdominal pain and hormonal variations.

Finally we are working on the development of local sales outlets.

Valoriz'me in the future ?

Valoriz'me's long-term ambition is to be recognised at a national level and become the number one nutrition brand dedicated to women. In the more distant future the company wants to develop internationally.

Valoriz'me and a AgreenStartup

While I was studying at the ESA, the business school wanted us to present a project. I had had Valoriz'me in my mind for a quite a while. I therefore decided to take part in the Agreen Startup Concours with my project. It was an interesting and enriching experience. It enabled me to look at my project in depth and to learn to make a pitch in front of a jury. It is also a competition that offers real visibility and support for the future. Finally, Agreen Startup enabled us to develop a network, and have discussions with other project holders, all within a really good atmosphere.

Created in 2016, la Ferme Digitale is a network of pioneering start-ups in agricultural innovation. Our 150 members are all working in the same direction with a joint aim: to make innovation simple, viable and profitable for farmers and businesses in the sector. More importantly our members offer technical and technological solutions to aid agriculture take the first step in its transformation and transition to cope with the different challenges that it is facing: climate change and agro-ecological transition, economic performance...

Each of our start-ups is independent. It is proof of objectivity and transparency for agriculture.

Finally in order to get things done, we have an influencing role, and act as spokesperson for agricultural innovation when dealing with the deciders in the agricultural world.

2/ What are the contours for digitalisation in the agricultural world ?

Digitalisation is still emerging and sometimes slow to solidify for several reasons. Reluctance to change is of course a reality, but above all there is the time, the means and the necessary risks required for a farmer to make full use of these tools. However farmers want to take part in this. Our role as an adviser and support provider is essential to enable them not only to equip their farms, but above all rethink their organisation and to provide training for them.

Farmers have all the qualities to make fantastic project leaders. We want to provide them with the power, and more freedom in their choices for their farms. It's a new way of dealing with risk, just as it is with any other, but with more methods and backup tools. 3/ How can digitalisation aid those involved in farming to face the challenges of transition (environment, climate, attractiveness, economic performance) ?

Innovation generally must enable farmers to answer the challenges. At la Ferme Digitale, we are convinced that innovation

Over the last several years a certain number of innovations linked to digitalisation were entered into these concours, what is your view of these innovations and these evolutions ?

These concours provide a real opportunity. Firstly for the participants by enabling them to work on an idea, an innovation... or simply to just take the plunge, but also, of course, for farming because they open new possibilities

and new horizons. For these young start-ups, the most important thing is to do, to explore, to try and to put ideas into practice and to find the things that will boost them and also those that will hold them back, to deal with market forces (which are not always the reality hoped for) and to succeed in demonstrating their concept. It's a long road, but worthwhile in regard to the challenges facing the future of agriculture.

The attractiveness of the sectors

A major challenge facing businesses in the specialist plant production sector

The attractiveness of the specialist plant production sectors is a key theme developed by the SIVAL.

Farming is facing up to profound economic and societal changes. Between the hopes of the new generations and the transformation of production methods, the sector is being renewed, adapting itself and asking itself the question: can we still live from the profession of farming? Will farms still be passed down from generation to generation? Who are the farmers of the future going to be? How can new working methods take the aspirations of new generations into account? These questions will be tackled at the SIVAL in a pragmatic way by proposing ideas that need to be considered and solutions via numerous speeches.

The Employment & Career area at the SIVAL, in partnership with APECITA, ANEFA and OCAPIAT, is working on the problem of attractiveness by proposing information, advice and support in the specialist plant production sector, using different methods, conferences and workshops that are organised each year at show.

...positions to be filled

We estimate that the annual requirement for farms in the Angers region is:

- •350 permanent employees in wine production,
- •440 permanent employees in market gardening,
- •160 permanent employees in tree production,

•225 permanent employees in horticulture nurseries.

The profiles sought are mainly for qualified workers who understand the production techniques, and are capable of driving and using equipment. The management/team leader/foreman positions concern 10 to 15% of the sector's requirements.

Little-known professions

Little-known by a population that is more and more « urban », often branded as difficult careers, undervalued and underpaid, these agricultural careers deserve to be better understood and known. They are numerous, diversified, as much for the qualifications required for the sector (tree production, wine production, milk production, farm equipment, etc...). The level of agricultural qualifications required is varied from a CAPA to a degree. The employment rate is 88 %, 30 months after finishing training.

(Figures from the Ministry of Agriculture).

In the Pays de la Loire, the means of acquiring initial training (school or apprenticeship) or on day release are generally satisfactory, as much for the different levels of courses available as for the geographical localisation. Whether one is still at college or lycée, an employment seeker or an adult undergoing reconversion, the possibilities for agricultural training exist in the region.

SIVAL will be associating itself for the fourth consecutive year with the SOLAAL Association in order to encourage exhibitors to make food donations throughout the three days of the show. To make this possible there will be three collection points at the show for exhibitors which will be cleared on Thursday, 16 January from 17h. Exhibitors will also have the opportunity to put their donated products on their stands on Thursday from 18h, for collection after the show's closure. Products authorised: fruits, vegetables, boxes of biscuits (not opened) vacuum packed prepared meals. The collection of food donations will be open to visitors again this year.



What is Solaal?

> SOLAAL is a recognised association that facilitates the organisation of donations from the agricultural and food processing sectors to the associations that distribute food aid. Each year SOLAAL enables 3500 tons of food products, mainly fresh produce to be collected, which is the equivalent of 7 million meals, benefiting the most impoverished members of society

>The Association is actively fighting against food wastage. As a result, since its creation, SOLAAL has enabled the recovery of **more than 35,000 tons of food products that would otherwise be thrown away**.

>This year the association is offering to buy and sell for charity. It is a means of buying products from farmers at a price that is satisfactory for them, as well as for the food aid associations who will be buying the produce. This new system will reinforce donations at a time when the demand for food aid from associations is exploding, particularly where fresh produce is concerned.
